














### The New Zealand Choral Federation Inc.

Our diverse community includes over 20,000 members from hundreds of community, school, and chamber choirs performing in styles ranging from classical, gospel, world music, sacred music and barbershop through to jazz, kapa haka, musical theatre, and opera.

NZCF aims to promote high-quality choral singing by providing a structure for choral professionals to improve their own skills as well as assist others, providing choral leadership training for conductors, and producing a range of events and educational opportunities that are designed to meet the needs of the diverse choral groups in New Zealand.

### **NZCF Events**

NZCF offers opportunities for choral singers around the country through community and chamber choir festivals and workshops. In addition to The Big Sing, the NZCF coordinates several other activities for singers:

- The Kids Sing primary and intermediate school choir festivals
- SingFest community and chamber choir festivals
- National Workshops regionally-based short courses for singers or conductors
- Sing Aotearoa Te Puna o te Wairua NZCF's multi-cultural choral festival; a blend of festival/ professional development opportunities for choirs and choir directors.

**The Association of Choral Directors (ACD)** is a professional development network for conductors, offering mentoring and conductor training for choral directors of all levels. It runs the following events:

- Fine Tuning professional development for school choirs taking part in The Big Sing
- Singing Matters regionally-based workshops for leaders of children's singing
- Giving Direction regionally-based workshops for choral conductors at all levels
- Choral Connect the ACD's biennial conference, most recently held in July 2021 in Auckland

### **About The Big Sing**

The Big Sing is New Zealand's largest choral event and has been a highlight of the secondary school music calendar for over 30 years. Around 8,000 young people from over 200 schools take part in regional festivals each year, and their feedback speaks of the inspiration, confidence and sense of belonging they gain from taking part.

The ongoing development of choirs at The Big Sing has resulted in many of our top school choirs touring overseas and presenting New Zealand choral music internationally.

### **Regional Festivals**

Regional festivals take place annually during May/June. Competing choirs are required to present a varied programme, including at least one New Zealand composition. Three or four nationally-appointed adjudicators travel to these regional festivals, commenting on performances and providing each participating choir with a written report. The adjudicators who undertook this huge task around the country in 2022 were Karen Grylls, David Hamilton and Andrew Withington.

We wish to acknowledge the significant contribution of the local committees for The Big Sing regional festivals. In 2022 these hard-working teams were headed by: Eveline Harvey (Auckland), Sarah Watts & Jeremy Whimster (Waikato-Bay of Plenty), Glenys Kempshall & Andrea Wilson (East Coast), Karen Hall (Manawatu-Whanganui), Toni Wilson (Wellington), Lucy Rainey & Emily Wragg (Nelson-Marlborough), Rosemary Fisher (Canterbury-West Coast), Rosemary Tarbotton (Otago-South Canterbury) and Alan Menzies (Southland).

At the conclusion of the regional festivals, 24 choirs are selected by the adjudicators to compete in The Big Sing National Finale and a further 36 choirs are selected to compete in one of three Cadenza festivals held respectively in the Upper North Island, Lower North Island and South Island.

### Cadenza

Established in 2019, Cadenza is held over two days in three centres, and blends a formal, adjudicated competition with combined-choir workshop-rehearsals, culminating in a gala concert and awards. Cadenza festivals are held in smaller regional centres and in 2022 are taking place held in Timaru (12-13 August), Whanganui (15-16 August), and Rotorua (21-22 August).

As of 2021 we have changed the names of our Cadenza awards to those of three iconic singing birds. In order of excellence, starting with the highest level, the awards are: **Tūī**, **Korimako** (Bellbird) and **Wharauroa** (Shining Cuckoo).

We are enormously grateful to each of the local coordinators who devoted many hours towards mounting these Cadenza festivals: Wayne Pahl (Timaru), Edwyna McDonald (Whanganui), Elizabeth Pilaar & Jenny Lewy (Rotorua).

### **Finale**

The Big Sing Finale rotates around the four main centres and in 2022 is being held in the Christchurch Town Hall. This year, each Finale choir is required to present two eight-minute recitals. Four songs will be performed, including two from their regional competition repertoire, with at least one being a New Zealand or Pasifika composition.

Our heartfelt thanks go to the Canterbury-West Coast TBS Committee, headed up by NZCF Canterbury-West Coast chair and TBS regional coordinator Rosemary Fisher, for all their hard work in staging The Big Sing Finale 2022.



### **National Finale Adjudicators**



### JUDY BELLINGHAM

Previously Associate Professor of Voice at Otago University, Judy Bellingham has now retired from all performing and academic life and is concentrating on teaching voice in her busy private studio, and presenting vocal and choral workshops throughout the country.

She is an internationally-recognised vocal clinician and has given papers at a number of overseas conferences, most recently in Sweden on the increasing use of taonga puoro in NZ vocal music, and in Australia on the influence of quality

New Zealand poetry on New Zealand vocal music.

She has published a book on sight-singing *Sing What You See*, *See What You Sing* and DVDs *Warm Me Up, Judy!* and *Body, Voice and Brain*. Judy has also recorded a CD of New Zealand song, and a DVD on historical Dunedin songs titled *Songs of Old Dunedin*. In 2016 she was appointed a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit (MNZM) in the Queen's 90th Birthday Honours List.



### **IGELESE ETE**

Tuilagi is Igelese's Samoan chief title hailing from the village of Fatausi in Savai'i. Igelese Ete is the Associate Professor and Associate Dean: Pacific at Massey University's College of Creative Arts in Wellington.

Igelese was formerly the Head of Performing Arts at the Oceania Centre for Arts Culture and Pacific Studies at the University of Pacific, Suva, Fiji, and was awarded the prestigious Creative New Zealand Senior Pacific Artist Award for his contribution to the promotion and performance of Pacific music in New

Zealand and the Pacific in 2009. In 2017, the Fiji Government appointed him Chairperson of the Fiji Arts Council Board. He has recently completed his PhD in Music.

With extensive conducting, composition, and teaching experience, Igelese was the New Zealand Choirmaster for Peter Jackson's acclaimed film *The Lord of the Rings: The Fellowship of the Ring,* and in 2016 he was contracted as choirmaster and music/choral consultant for the Disney Pacific animation *Moana*. Igelese is very passionate about the Pacific creative and performing arts and its ability to inspire, empower, educate, and uplift the world.



### JONO PALMER

Jono is a dynamic and enterprising conductor from Auckland. His choirs have won national and international acclaim, including two Gold Medals at the 2015 Grand Prix of Nations in Magdeburg, Germany, and many awards at regional and national festivals of The Big Sing.

As a conductor, Jono has been selected for masterclasses at the 2017 World Symposium of Choral Music and the 2017 National Collegiate Choral Organization National Conference. In October 2018, he was a finalist in the

inaugural London International Choral Conducting Competition.

In 2022, Jono took up the position of musical director for the Auckland Chamber Choir based at the University of Auckland, where he also lectures in conducting and music theory.

Jono earned a Master of Music in Choral Conducting from Indiana University, a BMus(Hons) in Performance Voice, and a BA in Ancient History from the University of Auckland. He has recently completed a doctorate in Choral Conducting from Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music.

### TIHI PUANAKI & TE HUAKI PUANAKI

Tihi Puanaki (Ngāti Hine/Ngāi Tahu) and her son Te Huaki Puanaki (Ngāti Hine/Ngāpuhi) are both highly acclaimed 'Premier Grade' Kapa Haka exponents, as performers, composers, choreographers, adjudicators, teachers and instructors

Tihi's numerous awards and accolades include a TSB Lifetime Achievement Award for Service to Education &

Māori Traditional Performing Arts, and a 'Keeper of the Traditions' Award at the National Māori Music Awards.

Te Huaki is a contemporary Reo Māori recording artist & composer, with seven self-produced albums to his credit. Te Huaki trained at the Christchurch Jazz School, has taught music in primary and secondary schools, and has worked as a kapa haka instructor for the New Zealand Secondary Students' Choir.

### NZCF-SOUNZ Choral Composition Award Adjudicator



### **ANTHONY RITCHIE**

Anthony Ritchie is a renowned composer whose works have been performed by ensembles such as The Takács Quartet, and soloists such as Bella Hristova. His Symphony No.4 *Stations* was one of the recordings of the year by MusicWeb International in 2015.

In 2016 Anthony was joint winner of The New Zealand Classical Album of the Year *Fjarran: In the Distance*. His choral work *Gallipoli to the Somme* was performed in London and Oxford in 2018. Anthony's book chapters include

'Gallipoli to the Somme: A Musical Witness to History' in *Studies in History and Sociology of Music* (2020).

Anthony is currently Professor of Music at Otago University, and Head of the School of Performing Arts.

### SOUNZ-NZCF Te Reo Māori Choral Composition Award Adjudicator



### REUBEN RAMEKA

Reuben Rameka BMus (Comp.), GradDipTchg(Sec) (b. 1997) is a music composer, arranger, performer, conductor and teacher based in Auckland. He is primarily of Ngāpuhi and Te Arawa descent.

In 2019, Reuben was selected as the APO 'Rising Star' Young Composer-in-residence where he was commissioned to write three new pieces for the Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra to premiere.

In 2020, Reuben's work *Takoto mai rā* won the Waiata Tira category in the *Compose Aotearoa!* choral composing competition. At the end of the same year, he completed his graduate diploma in teaching, specialising in secondary music education.

Reuben currently works as a music teacher and choral director at his old secondary school, Aorere College.



### Compère • MIRIAMA KAMO

Miriama has a distinguished career as a broadcast journalist and is well-known as the presenter for current affairs programmes *Sunday* and *Marae* on TVNZ 1. She is a board member for the Arts Foundation and is the Patron/Te Koruru of the New Zealander of the Year Awards.
