



REGIONAL FESTIVAL REGISTRATION 2023

1. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

A The Big Sing is open to choirs from individual schools, which may enter as many choirs as they wish. However, two schools may join to form a combined choir.

B All singers must be full-time day students of the participating school from Year 7 to 13, with an upper age limit of 19 as of 1 January (in conformity with the Education Act 1989, Section 3). The inclusion of Year 7 and 8 students is limited to schools designated as 'Area ' or as 'Year 7 to 13', with a maximum of 30% of the choir being Years 7 and 8. Each choir must have a minimum of 12 singers.

C Choirs are encouraged to enter a Regional Festival regardless of whether they wish to be considered for selection to Cadenza or Finale.

D Each choir may present one, two or three songs, amounting to no more than ten minutes 'total aggregate performance time.

E Choirs not wishing to compete, e.g. by not singing an item from each category, may still be eligible for regional awards.

F Choirs may sing with or without a conductor. Conductors, accompanists and backing musicians may be adults or students.

G Where fitting the musical style, e.g. vocal jazz, the use of microphones and/or backing track is permitted.

H Each school must hold a current OneMusic Licence to be eligible for inclusion in the Regional Festival.

I Choirs presenting works in te reo Māori should ensure that they, or the composer/arranger, have received in advance the appropriate permission from the relevant whānau or other kaitiaki (guardians) of the text and the music.

J All participating choirs will receive a written report on their performance after the Regional Festival.

K The Big Sing will be run in compliance with any NZ Government Covid-19 requirements that may be in place at the time of the event.

2. FOR SELECTION TO CADENZA OR FINALE

A Choirs must perform three pieces, selected from each of the designated categories of musical styles (see list below).

B Each choir's programme must include no more than ten minutes 'total aggregate performance time (applause and breaks between pieces are not included in the total aggregate). Exceeding the time limit will disqualify a choir from selection for Cadenza or Finale.

C A competing choir may not perform repertoire it sang at the most recent Regional Festival, Cadenza or Finale.

D All members of a choir must be involved in that choir's entire programme. Extensive use of solo voices is discouraged.

E Choir directors must provide the Regional Coordinator with a clear score (or words, where no written music exists) of each piece to be sung. Scores must be either an original publication or an authorised photocopy. Evidence of appropriate permissions for pieces in te reo Māori should be presented along with any sheet music before the choir's recital (see item 1.I above).

F Limits are in place regarding the percentage of singers from one choir that may sing in another.

i) No more than 20% of the members of a larger SA or TB* choir may sing in a smaller SA or TB* choir from the same school.

ii) No more than 50% of the members of a choir from one school may sing in a combined choir from two schools.

3. GENERAL INFORMATION

A Online registration will be open on The Big Sing page (www.nzcf.org.nz) from **18 February 2023**. Entries should be submitted by **18 March 2023**.

B The entry fee is **\$10.00** (incl. GST) per singer.

C Late entries will be accepted up until **5 April 2023** and won't incur a penalty. Schools with fees still unpaid by **9 May** will incur a **\$100** penalty.

D Regional Coordinators will contact each entering school with further information about their Regional Festival and for details about their choir(s).

E Travel and other costs are the responsibility of individual choirs or schools.

F Entry fees are not refundable in the event of withdrawal after **16 May 2023**. Choirs withdrawing before this date will be entitled to a refund of their fee, less an administration fee of **\$60**. Notification of withdrawal should be sent to the Regional Coordinator who will inform the NZCF Events Manager.

CADENZA 2023

LOCATIONS AND DATES

The three 2023 Cadenza festivals will be held in:

- Timaru: 11-12 August (covering the Marlborough-Nelson, Canterbury-West Coast, Otago-South Canterbury and Southland regions)
- Rotorua: 14-15 August (covering the Northland, Auckland and Waikato-Bay of Plenty regions)
- Whanganui: 17-18 August (covering the East Coast, Taranaki, Manawatu-Whanganui and Wellington regions)

ADJUDICATORS

The names of the Cadenza adjudicator or adjudicators will be announced on the NZCF website.

SELECTION

A After the Regional Adjudication Panel has selected the choirs to attend Finale, it will select a further 12 choirs from each of the regional areas listed above – a total of 36 choirs from around New Zealand. Choirs selected as Finale reserves will be entitled to go to their area Cadenza if they are not called on for Finale.

The adjudicators' decision is final and no discussion or correspondence will be entered into.

B A maximum of one choir per school will be selected. A minimum of two SATB and two TB* choirs will be chosen for each festival.

C No more than 50% of the members of an SA or TB* choir may sing in a combined-school SATB choir.

D Singers participating in Cadenza choirs must be the same as those who performed in their regional events. Each choir must sing its entire repertoire with all its members performing.

FORMAT

E Competing choirs will present two recitals, each consisting of two items. A maximum of 8 minutes' total performance time is allowed for each recital.

F Of these four items, at least one must be chosen from each of Category One and Two (see Categories of Musical Styles below). A maximum of one item may have been performed by the choir at last year's Regional festival, but none may have been performed by the choir at last year's Cadenza or Finale.

G In the event of a violation of the Cadenza criteria, NZCF may withdraw or reduce any award earned.

H Each Cadenza festival will conclude with a Gala Concert featuring all choirs in a showcase of music performed over the two days, along with some massed items. Each choir will be required to perform one item from their Cadenza repertoire (see **M**).

I Where appropriate to the musical style of the chosen item, up to two microphones and a backing track may be used.

CADENZA FEE

J A fee of \$12 per singer will be charged to help with running costs. This will be invoiced on the choir's acceptance.

K Entry fees are not refundable in the event of withdrawal after **16 July 2023**. Choirs withdrawing before this date will be entitled to a 50% refund of their fee. Notification of withdrawal should be sent to the NZCF Events Manager.

TRAVEL AND ACCOMMODATION

L Each choir is responsible for arranging and funding its own accommodation and travel.

GALA CONCERT ITEMS

M Choirs may nominate the piece from their programme that they wish to perform in the Gala Concert. However, the adjudicator may, for programming purposes, ask them to sing a different piece.

AWARDS

Tūi, Korimako and Wharauoa Awards will be presented to competing choirs that achieve the appropriate standard. Judging criteria will be forwarded to the selected choirs prior to Cadenza. Again, the adjudicators' decisions are final.

NATIONAL FINALE 2023

LOCATIONS AND DATES

National Finale will be held in the Auckland Town Hall, from Friday 25 to Sunday 27 August 2023.

ADJUDICATORS

The names of the Adjudicator Panel for Finale will be announced on the NZCF website.

SELECTION

A The Regional Adjudicator Panel will select the 24 top-scoring choirs to attend Finale. The adjudicators' decision is final and no discussion or correspondence will be entered into.

B A maximum of two choirs per school will be selected. A minimum of five SATB and four TB* choirs will be chosen for Finale.

C i) No more than 20% of the members of a larger SA or TB* choir may sing in a smaller choir of similar make-up.

ii) No more than 50% of the members of a SA or TB* choir may sing in an SATB choir.

D Singers participating in Finale choirs must be the same as those who performed in their regional events. Each choir must sing its entire repertoire with all its members performing.

FORMAT

E Competing choirs will present two recitals, the first of three items of no more than 10 minutes' total performance time, and the second of two items of no more than 8 minutes' total performance time.

F Of these five items, at least one must be chosen from Category One and at least two from Category Two, with the remaining two items from Category Three 'Open Choice' (see Category of Musical Styles below). There is no requirement for a choir to repeat any of its repertoire from this year's Regional. However, a maximum of two items may have been performed by the choir at last year's Regional, and none may have been performed at last year's Cadenza or Finale.

G In the event of a violation of the Finale criteria, NZCF may withdraw or reduce any award earned.

H The Finale will conclude with a Gala Concert at the Auckland Town Hall on Sunday 27 August, which will feature all choirs in a showcase of music performed over the three days. Each choir is required to perform one item from their Finale repertoire (see **M**).

I Where appropriate to the musical style of the chosen item, up to two microphones and a backing track may be used.

FINALE FEE

J A fee of \$12 per singer is charged to help with running costs. This will be invoiced on the choir's acceptance.

K Entry fees are not refundable in the event of withdrawal after **16 July 2023**. Choirs withdrawing before this date will be entitled to a 50% refund of their fee. Notification of withdrawal should be sent to the NZCF Events Manager.

TRAVEL AND ACCOMMODATION

L Each choir is responsible for arranging and funding its accommodation and travel.

GALA CONCERT ITEMS

M Choirs may nominate the piece from their programme that they wish to perform in the Gala Concert. However, the adjudicators may, for programming purposes, ask them to sing a different piece.

AWARDS

Gold, Silver, Bronze and Finalist Awards will be presented to competing choirs that achieve the appropriate standard. Judging criteria will be forwarded to the selected choirs prior to the Finale. Again, the adjudicators' decisions are final.

The Auahi Kore Māori Performance Award will be awarded for the best all-round performance of a work using a text in te reo Māori.

The Hutt City Trophy will be awarded for the best performance of a New Zealand or Pasifika composition (Category One). It is possible for a choir to win both the Auahi Kore Award and the Hutt City Trophy.

The Tour Time Trophy, presented by TBS sponsor Tour Time, will be awarded for the best performance of a Category Two piece.

The Big Sing Youth Ambassadors Award will be awarded to the choir that, in the opinion of the organisers, demonstrates outstanding engagement with all elements of Finale and, through its general demeanour, shows the qualities and spirit requisite of Ambassadors for Youth. NZCF need not make this award if, in the organisers' opinion, no choir has met the criteria.

The SOUNZ-NZCF Choral Composition Award SOUNZ-NZCF Te Reo Māori Choral Composition Competition will be offered in 2023, alongside the existing SOUNZ-NZCF Choral Composition Competition. The winners of both competitions will receive their award at Finale and performances or recordings of both the winning entries will be played at the Gala Concert.

CATEGORIES OF MUSICAL STYLES 2023

CATEGORY ONE

New Zealand Composition/Arrangement

- Māori
- Pasifika
- New Zealand Art Music (original composition, sacred or secular)
- New Zealand Folk Music (traditional lyrics and melody in a choral arrangement)
- New Zealand Popular Music

CATEGORY TWO

Choral Art Music

Secular or sacred music of any age, written originally, or arranged specifically, for choir or vocal ensemble, excluding Gospel and Popular music (eg jazz, swing, pop, rock, hip hop, rap).

Note that New Zealand Choral Art Music is also allowed in this category.

CATEGORY THREE

Open Choice

Formerly called Director's Choice, this category includes all choral music, including pieces that fall into Categories One and Two.

Choirs are encouraged to present a balanced programme showing variety of style, genre and mood. Adjudicators will reward programmes that demonstrate stylistic variety and technical accomplishment.

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

In their assessment of TBS performances, adjudicators will take the following elements into consideration.

Artistic merit

- Communication
- Interpretation
- Presentation
- Performance style

Technical skill

- Consistency of intonation
- Vocal quality and balance
- Diction and language
- Complexity of the score
