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

The Association of Choral Directors (ACD) is a professional development network for conductors, offering mentoring and conductor training for choral directors of all levels. It runs the following events:

- Giving Direction regionally based workshops for choral conductors at all levels
- Choral Connect the ACD's biennial conference, most recently held in September 2023 in Auckland

About The Big Sing

The Big Sing is New Zealand's largest choral event and has been a highlight of the secondary school music calendar for over 30 years. Around 8,000 young people from over 200 schools take part in regional festivals each year, and their feedback speaks of the inspiration, confidence and sense of belonging they gain from taking part.

The ongoing development of choirs at The Big Sing has resulted in many of our top school choirs touring overseas and presenting New Zealand choral music internationally.

Regional Festivals

Regional festivals take place annually during May and June. Competing choirs are required to present a varied programme, including at least one New Zealand composition. Three or four nationally-appointed adjudicators travel to these regional festivals, commenting on performances and providing each participating choir with a written report. The adjudicators who undertook this huge task around the country in 2024 were Shawn Condon, Anthony Ritchie and Rosemary Turnbull.

We wish to acknowledge the significant contribution of the local committees for The Big Sing regional festivals. In 2024 these hard-working teams were headed by: Sophie van Waardenberg (Auckland), Bonnie Hebenton and Jeremy Whimster (Waikato-Bay of Plenty), Andrea Wilson (East Coast), Karen Hall (Manawatu-Whanganui), Julie Sperring (Wellington), Jody Freeman (Nelson-Marlborough), Caitlin Godfrey (Canterbury-West Coast), Rosemary Tarbotton (Otago-South Canterbury) and Alan Menzies (Southland).

At the conclusion of the regional festivals, 24 choirs are selected by the adjudicators to compete in The Big Sing National Finale and a further 36 choirs are selected to compete in one of three Cadenza festivals held respectively in the Upper North Island, Lower North Island and South Island.

Cadenza

Established in 2019, Cadenza is held over two days in three centres, and blends a formal, adjudicated competition with combined-choir workshop-rehearsals, culminating in a gala concert and awards, Cadenza festivals are held in smaller regional centres and in 2024 are taking place in Hastings (12-13 August), Timaru (16-17 August), and Rotorua (24-25 August).

Our Cadenza awards are named after three iconic singing birds. In order of excellence, starting with the highest level, the awards are: Tūī, Korimako (Bellbird) and Wharauroa (Shining Cuckoo).

We are enormously grateful to each of the local coordinators who devoted many hours towards mounting these Cadenza festivals: Andrea Wilson (Hastings), Martin Kane (Timaru), and Jenny Lewy (Rotorua).

Finale

The Big Sing Finale rotates around the four main centres and in 2024 is being held in the Michael Fowler Centre. Each Finale choir is required to present two recitals. Five songs will be performed, including three from their regional competition repertoire, with at least one being a New Zealand or Pasifika composition.

Our heartfelt thanks go to the Wellington TBS Committee, and Finale Coordinator Julie Sperring, for all their hard work in staging The Big Sing Finale 2024.

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National Finale Adjudicators



Paul Holley OAM is a conductor and music educator with over 30 years of teaching and conducting experience. He is the Artistic Director of Voices of Birralee, a community youth and children's choir organisation based in Brisbane. He conducts two of the signature choirs, the Birralee Blokes and Resonance of Birralee, awardwinning ensembles who have toured nationally and internationally, made numerous recordings, performed with professional artists and supported community events.

Paul is the Artistic Director of the Pemulwuy! National Male Voice Festival, a triennial festival that draws together men of all ages to sing together and build community. He is also the co-conductor of the national youth choir Gondwana Chorale which has toured the USA, UK and the Baltics and most recently NZ in 2023. In addition to these roles, Paul is a workshop presenter, choral clinician,

guest conductor and mentor to younger conductors. He was awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia in January 2016 for his services to choral music.



Auahi Kore adjudicator **Toni Huata** is a Māori songstress, actor, performer, director and producer. Hailing from Hastings, she was surrounded by an eclectic array of influences including the Anglican church choir, tap dancing, musical theatre and Mäori cultural performance. She affiliates to Ngāti Kahungunu and Rongowhakaata iwi, and is also of Lebanese, German, Scandinavian and Irish descent.

Toni graduated in music at Whitireia Polytechnic, then toured throughout NZ for four years in Jim Moriarty's Te Rakau Hua o Te Wao Tapu theatre company. In 2019, she was the inaugural appointment to the role of Kaihautū Puoro Māori | Director of Māori Music at SOUNZ. She has released seven albums, the most recent of which is *Te Rerenga* (*The Journey*).



Henrietta Hunkin-Tagaloa was born and raised in Wellington and represents the villages of Faleula and Apia (Samoa), and Mutulau (Niue). With over 20 years' experience in the barbershop craft, Henrietta has won many national quartet and chorus championships and represented NZ on the international stage since 2005. She is a certified Singing Judge in the Australasian Guild of Barbershop Judges, coaches barbershop quartets and choirs around the country, and acts as a mentor for NZCF in the Mana Pasifika outreach programme. She is also a member of Signature Choir who recently filled Spark Arena in Auckland, a first for a Pacific community choir.

Henrietta is the founder and Co-Director of Pacific Connection who competed in their first barbershop competition in 2022, won with the highest score in NZ

history, and went on to place eighth in the world in 2023. She is the Vice President of Barbershop Harmony NZ, and holds a BA in Music Studies from Victoria University of Wellington. She is a mother of two and is the Pacific Director at Tū Ora Compass Health.



Michael Stewart is at the forefront of choral conducting in New Zealand, as well as being one of the country's leading concert organists. He is Organist and Director of Music at the Wellington Cathedral of St Paul, Music Director of The Tudor Consort, and Deputy Music Director of the New Zealand Youth Choir.

Michael has led critically acclaimed performances of Handel's *Messiah* and *Israel in Egypt* and J S Bach's *Christmas Oratorio* and *St Matthew Passion* with The Tudor Consort, and has prepared both The Tudor Consort and Voices New Zealand for performances with the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra.


